The Lady Cats added two more runs in the second frame and held on for the 6-5 victory.

Sulphur Springs had 10 hits in the game. Kiara Johnson had two hits, one run batted in. Jaleigh Avery also had two hits. Sarah Womack clubbed a double. Adding singles were Makayla Glosson, Sierra Nickerson, Molly Johnston and Katie Barnett.

Katie Sapaugh was the winning pitcher with an eight strikeout performance. She allowed five runs, (four earned) off seven hits, walking six and allowing a home run.

Sapaugh threw 152 pitches, 93 for strikes.

The final game of the tournament was also a win for Sulphur Springs as they defeated Mesquite Poteet, 7-4.

Sapaugh got the complete game win with eight strikeouts. She allowed four runs, all unearned, while walking one.
