Derrell was born July 9, 1927, in Ridgeway, Texas, the oldest son of Will and Addie Matthews. During the depression years, times were difficult for the growing family and work was scarce around Weaver, Texas.

The family lived in a wooden boxcar near the railroad station house where Will worked. But the family was close knit and back then the neighbors were friends and helped one another. Derrell loved to walk, fish and camp out with his father in the nearby creeks.

Derrell took a job with the Western Union Company when he was just 15. He was sent to Gypsum, Kansas to build telegraph lines. He also built lines in Missouri, Colorado and Texas. He stayed with Western Union for 46 1/2 years until his retirement Sept. 29, 1989, holding many jobs with increasing responsibility within the Company headquarters in Dallas after the war.

Derrell joined the Army and served from April 1946 to his honorable discharge as a Corporal in October 1947. He met his future wife, Laquita (Kita) McDonald on a bus ride from Dallas back to visit his family in Weaver. Kita and Derrell were married Jan. 29, 1949, and were blessed with three children, Sarah Beth, Debra Kay and Stephen Glen. After retirement, Derrell and Kita moved back to Hopkins County and lived near Sulphur Springs for the remainder of their lives.

Derrell was most proud of his born again relationship with his Savior Jesus Christ. Derrell faithfully served as a deacon at Elm Ridge Church in Como, Texas. He was also thankful that he lived to see and experience the saving faith of his three children and many of his grandchildren.
